Each day 91 Americans die as the result of an opioid/heroin overdose. In North Carolina, three people die each day due to opioids or heroin. Information on how opioids and heroin affect the body and cause addiction, community resources to support recovering addicts, and basic emergency management of an overdose including how to administer naloxone (opiate/heroin antidote) will be provided.
