# ACEs, Trauma, and Burnout: From Surviving to Thriving

On March 5th and 6th, Area L AHEC hosted the conference *ACEs, Trauma, and Burnout: From Surviving to Thriving* at Word Tabernacle in Rocky Mount, NC. During this two-day conference, participants were able to hear from experts about the impacts of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), trauma, and burnout. They also heard personal experiences of ACEs and trauma and gained knowledge and competence on utilizing tools and resources geared toward building resilience. This conference featured Derek Clark, Dr. Ramani Durvasula, Dr. Kelly Graves, Dr. Stephen Loyd, Dr. Susan Bane, Dr. Dawn O'Malley, and Dr. Brandynicole Brooks. # PRACTICE SUPPORT SERVICES

- Do you need assistance with Fee & Revenue analysis to compare your current fee schedule and private payer reimbursement to current Medicare Physician Fee Schedule (MPFS) rates?
  - If you answered "yes" then we have a tool for you! This tool can be used to collect & analyze data on private insurance reimbursement rates to assist you with contract negotiations! Contact us today for more information.
- Merit Incentive Payment System (MIPS) eligibility for the 2024 performance year will be updated based on the June 30th Alternative Payment Model (APM) snapshot (snapshot 2). Note: Qualifying APM Participant (QP) determinations and MIPS APM participation information will be available on the QPP Participation Status Tool.
- Calendar Year 2025 Medicare PFS Proposed Rule: Average payment rates under the PFS are proposed to be reduced by 2.93% in CY 2025 compared to the average amount these services are being paid for most of CY 2024. The change to the PFS conversion factor incorporates the 0.00 percent overall update required by statute, the expiration of the 2.93% increase in payment for CY 2024 required by statute, and a relatively small estimated 0.05% adjustment necessary to account for changes in work relative value units (RVUs) for some services. This amounts to a proposed estimated CY 2025 PFS conversion factor of \$32.36, a decrease of \$0.93 (or 2.80%) from the current CY 2024 conversion factor of \$33.29.

- Office of National Coordinator (ONC) Health Data,
   Technology, and Interoperability: Patient Engagement,
   Information Sharing, and Public Health Interoperability
   (HTI-2) Proposed Rule: Implements provisions of the 21st
   Century Cures Act and reflects ONC's focused efforts to
   advance interoperability and improve information sharing
   among patients, providers, payers, and public health
   authorities. Key proposals include:
  - Two sets of new certification criteria, designed to enable health IT for public health as well as health IT for payers to be certified under the ONC Health IT Certification Program. Both sets of certification criteria focus heavily on standards-based application programming interfaces to improve end-to-end interoperability between data exchange partners.
  - Technology and standards updates that build on the HTI-1 final rule, ranging from the capability to exchange clinical images to the addition of multi-factor authentication support.

# HEALTH PATHWAY HIGHLIGHTS

Pathway programs are designed to introduce students from rural and/or underserved communities to a variety of health professions. Our aim is to inspire and provide students with insights into these professions, encouraging students to consider them as potential future careers. Take a look at just a few of our summer Pathway highlights!

• Classrooms2Careers - Area L AHEC partnered with UNC Health Nash Hospital to offer a day-long experience for high school students in Nash County to explore health careers within a hospital setting. Thirteen students toured multiple departments, such as surgical services and radiology, engaged with healthcare professionals, and participated in hands-on activities – even learning skills needed in robotic surgery!

• Emergency Med Day - Over 40 students visited Area L AHEC in June to learn about careers in emergency medicine! Students were trained in Stop the Bleed, toured an ambulance with a community paramedic from Wilson County EMS, and heard from our very own former trauma nurse and Director of Nursing and Interdisciplinary CPD, Patty Collins.

• **Health Careers Academy** - Through a partnership with Edgecombe Community College (ECC), 20 students in Edgecombe County participated in a weeklong health sciences enrichment camp hosted at ECC June 10th-14th. Throughout the week, students learned about health-related degree programs available at ECC, participated in anatomy and physiology lectures, earned multiple certifications, and visited ECU Health Edgecombe hospital!

• Summer Health Careers Boot Camp - Area L AHEC partnered with ECU Health North Hospital to offer a day-long experience for 31 high school students in Halifax and Northampton Counties. Students participated in Stop the Bleed and CPR training, visited the hospital lab, watched a helicopter landing, and listened in on a panel discussion with various health professionals.
